- To teach your child(ren) the Catholic prayers, the Ten Commandments, The Gifts and Fruits of the Holy Spirit and other fundamentals of living a faithful life.
- To teach your child(ren) what it means to live a virtuous life, what sin and temptation are, and how to avoid them.
- To encourage your child(ren) to attend Confession regularly.
- To spend time, each week, as a family, putting aside digital technology and busy schedules in order to love one another unconditionally.
- To give back to others by helping St. John the Baptist with your time, talent, and treasure and participate in acts of charity and community outreach.
